Scott stated that the Town Board will review the request for a backup and will look at it again at the February Town Board Meeting.

OPEN THE MEETING TO THE PUBLIC:

<u>John McNair – Route 44</u> – stated that he was in receipt of 51 pages of petitions with 407 signatures regarding Resolutions; 60/2011, 61/2011, 62/2011 and also requesting a public vote on the purchase of 215 West Road. John would like to present the petitions to the Town Clerk.

The Town Board requested that he present the petitions to the Town Clerk during normal business hours so the petition can be recorded properly.

Town Attorney, Scott Volkman also requested that the petition be filed during normal business hours so they can be properly stamped in and recorded.

<u>Faith Vasti – Patricia Drive</u> – stated that she has been a resident for a very long time and been involved with real estate. Faith asked how the Town Board arrived at the price and was an appraisal done on this property.

<u>Supervisor Tomik</u> – noted that this isn't the forum to question the Town Board. Supervisor Tomik suggested that Faith state her concerns and than the Town Board can review them.

<u>Councilman Sagliano</u> – asked if the questions can be given to the Town Clerk or the Supervisor's Office so a document can be put together with everyone's questions and a public document prepared for the residents.

<u>Councilwoman Campbell</u> – asked the Town Attorney that if this goes to a referendum will it be published and advertised.

<u>Town Attorney</u>, <u>Scott Volkman</u> – stated yes it would be advertised and there will be steps that the Town Board will have to follow. The Town Board would have to adopt resolutions before putting the notice in the paper.

<u>Councilwoman Campbell</u> – by publishing in the paper it would give residents time to submit written comments to the Town Board.

<u>Faith Vasti – Patricia Drive</u> – stated that her husband and son where both on the Town Board has never heard that a resident couldn't ask a question.

<u>Councilwoman Campbell</u> – noted to Faith that she has every right to make her comments and make it part of the public record, at this time the Town Board isn't going to answer questions.

<u>Town Attorney, Volkman</u> – noted that there is no legal obligation for a Town Board to enter any public comment during the meeting, it has been the tradition of this Town Board to do so. Public comment forum is for the residents to make comments to the Town Board and make it part of the record. The Town Board is not prepared to have a dialogue with the residents, but they are interested in hearing the resident's comments.

The Town Board and Faith Vasti had discussion regarding questions she would like the Town Board to answer.

<u>Steve MacNish – Valley View Road</u> – stated that he has about 60 years of experience with facility use work. Steve stated that if the Town needs help in crunching numbers to see what the cost would be for the Town to run the building he is willing to help.

<u>Meta Poltnik – Route 44</u> – noted that she is the Chairwoman of the CAC and is very interested in having the public use Redl Park. Meta feels that the building would be very useful for the Town since it is next to Redl Park. Meta would like to encourage people to think of the benefits the building would have for the Town.

<u>Jackie Freeman – Creek Road</u> – asked before the residents vote on the building are the residents going to be able to see what it will cost the Town to run it and what is the building going to be used for.

<u>Town Attorney, Scott Volkman</u> – noted that there is a fact sheet available in Town Hall.

<u>Councilwoman Campbell</u> – stated that the residents shouldn't wait until the referendum to get their comments to the Town Board.

<u>Supervisor Tomik</u> – the Town Board has moved on with the process but can't say it is a done deal

Councilman Sagliano- stated that the previous Town Board has worked on this project for several months and Resolutions were voted on, and on every occasion the votes were 5/0. At the last minute it was changed from just a recreation building to a multi use building. Councilman Sagliano thanked the residents for coming tonight it greatly appreciated.

<u>Jean Curlee – Stream Lane</u> – Feels that a public referendum is great for the Town. Jean feels that the Town Board should set a date for an informational meeting before the referendum. Jean spoke about the floods in 2007 and 2011 and how much money was spent for them.

<u>Chris Hart – Smith Road</u> – stated that he is for the purchase of the building. The current Town Hall is over crowed. He feels that the new Board should get the information to the residents and maybe have an open house for the residents to tour the building. Chris feels that over all it is a good investment for the Town.

<u>Tom Vasti – Patricia Drive</u> – doesn't feel that the Town is getting the bang for the buck. Purchasing a building for \$600,000.00 and than have to put \$400,000.00 worth of renovations into it, the residents need more information. Tom feels that the residents deserve to hear what the building is going to be used as. Tom noted that the State is having a Special Election on March 20th and the referendum can be done on the same day.

<u>James "Buddy" Femenlla – Hibernia Road</u> – stated that he doesn't come to many meetings but feels that the building is not a good choice for the Town. Buddy stated that the Highway Building is falling apart and how many parks to we need.

<u>Steve MacNish – Valley View</u> – asked how many feet does the court need to be from a school.

<u>Paul Case – Brookside Road</u>- is in favor of purchasing the building. Feels where the building is there is a lot of flexibility for the development of Redl Park.

<u>Tom Sipos – Traver Road</u> – asked if there is any restriction on selling the current property.

<u>Faith Vasti – Patricia Drive</u>- stated that the Town needs to get the best value and is the building worth the money. Faith noted that if the Town went through a bank for a commercial loan they would require you to test the well and check oil tanks.

<u>Rolando Ghedini – Arbor Hill Drive</u> – thinks that this is a good deal for the Town and asked why now all the questions.

Sandra also presented to the Town Board a draft of an RFP to solicit a consultant (filed with the minutes) to help them complete open space protection plan.

<u>Item # 5 – Community Garden/Joe Baldwin:</u>

Joe Baldwin introduced Justin Bird who read an essay regarding community gardens.

Joe Baldwin gave a presentation to the Town Board regarding having a community garden at Redl Park. Joe noted that grants can be applied for community gardens. Joe noted that Dutchess Community College and Marist College are very involved in community gardens.

Joe noted that the gardens can be used by the residents of Pleasant Valley, no money can be exchanged and if there is produce left over it can be given to the poor. Joe noted that anyone who would like to participate would have to pay \$35.00 per lot to get started.

<u>Mark Doctoroff – Gretna Woods</u> – asked what is the Town's view on having the community garden at Redl Park.

<u>Supervisor, Carl Tomik</u> – noted that the Town has to look into this. Supervisor Tomik noted that the Town Board would have to check with its insurance carrier and see if it can be on public property. Supervisor Tomik also noted that he would check with other Towns to see what they do regarding the community gardens.

<u>Item # 4 – Establish Date for Special Election Re: Financing of Acquisition of 215 West Road:</u>

Town Attorney, Scott Volkman noted that the intent for the following resolution is to set the date for the referendum election. Scott noted that the Town Board has a time frame to have the election and that would between March 12 and March 27. The Town Board has to set the date and time so there is enough time to have it published in the paper and have the ballots prepared. The resolution will set the time and date for the referendum. Scott also noted that the Town Board has had discussion regarding the Special Election on March 20, 2012 for the 103rd Assembly District and possibly having the referendum on the same date. The resolution also includes the three resolutions that were adopted in December and it also acknowledges that petition's were filed calling for the referendum. Scott noted that the Town Board has to set the date for the election, set the hours for the election, will need to establish the polling sites and if the Town Board wants to have the election with the Special Election they can still have one (1) polling site or at all the polling sites. Scott noted that the Town would have to have their own machines. The Town would have to pay for the machines and the election inspectors.

Scott reviewed with the Town Board what would be on the ballot it would include the

resolutions that were adopted at the December 14, 2011 meeting. Scott also noted that the resolution also authorizes the Town Clerk to advertise in the Poughkeepsie Journal. The Town Board needs to decide tonight what day and polling places they want to do. Scott also talked about whether the Town Board wants to have absentee ballots and when they want to have registration. Scott noted that the absentee ballots would go through the Town Clerk's Office. Scott noted that if the Town Board wants residents to be able to vote by absentee ballot they have to have a date set for personnel registration. Scott noted that a resident doesn't have to be a registered voter but they would have to be an elector to be eligible to vote in the special election but they would need to register. Scott noted that if the Town Board chose to have the special election on March 20 the Town Board would have to have registration at each polling site, for 4 hours and the Town would have to pay the inspectors. Scott stated to the Town Board that they need to decide weather they want to have the referendum on March 20 or set another date.

<u>Councilwoman Campbell</u> - stated that there is 3 propositions and what happens if 2 passes 1 fails or 2 fail 1 passes and why are there 3 propositions and not as one.

<u>Town Attorney, Volkman</u> – noted that they are three (3) separate resolutions that were adopted and the petitions were set up as three (3) separate resolutions. Scott noted that if one (1) fails than the Town Board would have to decide how they would want to make up the difference.

<u>Councilwoman Campbell</u> – asked if the guidelines are the same for voting the person would have to be 18 years old to vote and would they have to show proof of residency.

<u>Town Attorney</u>, <u>Volkman</u> – noted that yes they would follow the same guidelines as a regular election.

<u>Councilwoman Campbell</u> – noted that the cost to have the referendum on March 20 is very high. Councilwoman Campbell would like to have the referendum on one day and at one polling site to help cut the cost.

<u>Supervisor Tomik</u> – stated that there is three (3) proposition, if one of the proposition's fail does it void the contract with the owner of the building.

<u>Town Attorney</u>, <u>Volkman</u>- noted that if any of the proposition failed the Town Board has the right to cancel the contract.

Councilwoman Milicaj – asked if a date has been set for the informational meeting.

<u>Town Attorney, Volkman</u> – noted that no date has been set.

<u>Supervisor Tomik</u> – feels that the informational meeting should be 1 to 2 weeks before the vote.

Councilman Sagliano – asked if the date for the referendum is limited to one day of the

week does it have to be Monday through Friday.

<u>Town Attorney</u>, <u>Volkman</u> – noted that the vote has to be during the week.

<u>Councilman Sagliano</u> – if the Town Board chose to have the referendum on the same day as the Special Election who would have to fill out an absentee ballot can be used for anyone who wants to vote or do they personnel have to register to vote to get an absentee ballot or is the special registration just for someone who wants to vote on the referendum.

<u>Town Attorney, Volkman</u> – noted that a special registration is held for people who want to vote just for the referendum. There is a special time frame and application for the absentee ballots not the same as a regular vote. Scott noted that the absentee ballot needs to be received by the day of the election.

<u>Councilman Sagliano</u> – asked if the absentee ballot for the referendum has to be returned on the day of the referendum what is the time frame for someone to obtain an application and to have enough time to return the ballot.

<u>Town Attorney, Volkman</u> – noted that there is enough time because it falls with the time frame. The registration date has to occur within 10 to 15 days. The special date has to be no less than 10 days no more than 15 days.

The Town Board had much discussion regarding when they should hold the referendum and if they want to have a special registration day.

<u>Councilwoman Campbell</u> – noted that the Town did not budget for a referendum but if the Town Board should hold a special informational meeting and have one place to vote with no absentee ballots. Set the date for the referendum and the special informational meeting.

<u>Councilwoman Milicaj</u> – noted that Councilwoman Campbell and Councilman Sagliano had some good points and 400 people signed the petitions so they must feel strongly about voting on the referendum.

Supervisor Tomik – doesn't feel it about how much you spend but what you are getting.

<u>Councilman Sagliano</u> – asked who has to register to vote in the referendum?

<u>Town Attorney</u>, <u>Volkman</u> – noted that you don't have to register for the referendum if you are a registered voter you are eligible to vote.

<u>Councilman Sagliano</u> – a registered voter can vote. Is there any requirements to hold a registration day.

<u>Town Attorney, Volkman</u> – noted that there are no requirements to hold a special registration day it optional.

Motion by Councilwoman Campbell to set the personal registration date for March 14, 2012 and the referendum date as March 21, 2012 with no absentee ballots,

<u>Town Attorney</u>, <u>Volkman</u> – noted that if you have a registration date than you have to absentee ballots.

Motion by Councilwoman Campbell set the referendum date for March 21, 2012, one (1) polling place with the hours from 12:00noon to 9:00PM with no personal registration and no absentee ballots, seconded by Councilman Albrecht.

WHEREAS, the Town Board Town of Pleasant Valley, Dutchess County, New York, duly adopted on December 14, 2011, a Resolution, subject to permissive referendum, authorizing the expenditure of \$150,000, of funds from the "Parks and Recreation Reserve Fund" from the Town of Pleasant Valley, Dutchess County, New York, to pay part of the cost of acquisition of 215 West Road; and

WHEREAS, a Petition for a Referendum was duly filed pursuant to Article 7 of the New York State Town Law requiring a referendum on the three Resolutions described herein; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board Town of Pleasant Valley, Dutchess County, State of New York, as follows:

Section 1: A Special Election of the Town of Pleasant Valley will be held on March 22, 2012, between the hours of 12:00p.m. and 9:00 p.m., prevailing time or as much longer as maybe necessary to enable voters then present to cast their votes, at which Special Town Election the propositions as set below shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the Town and must be approved by the affirmative vote of the majority voting on such a propositions.

<u>Item # CDBG – Flood Mitigation Plan:</u>

Town Engineer, Greg Bolner reviewed with the Town Board the flood mitigation plan and stated that the County has agreed to the plan but the Town Board would have to decide which one they want to go with and let the County know.

Item # 2 – Recreation Summer Camp:

Recreation Director, Sandra Coe reviewed with the Town Board a proposal for the Summer Camp to be held at Rainbows End for the 11-15 years old since camp can not be held at Cady Park. Sandy talked about running the camp with the YMCA (who runs Rainbow Ends Daycare Program). Sandy noted that the sessions would be 3/2week sessions and it would be full day 9:00AM to 4:30PM, the cost would be \$350.00 for Residents/\$375.00 for Non-Residents. Sandy also spoke about paying the Counselors a stipend instead of an hourly rate.

Councilman Albrecht asked about the insurance.

Councilman Sagliano asked about how many campers would have to enroll to off set the cost and asked where the CIT's would be.

Recreation Director, Sandy Coe noted that the CIT's would be a West Road School.

Town Attorney, Scott Volkman stated that a tentative agreement would have to be drawn up and he would look into municipal camps being run on private property.

Recreation Director, Sandy Coe reviewed with the Town Board regarding running a Basketball program, to be run at Arlington Middle School, July 23-27 with the Magic Masters.

Sandy also spoke incorporating a field usage fee for field usage.

<u>Item # 3 – Community Garden:</u>

Mark Doctoroff, Gretna Woods Road – gave the Town Board an outline of how the community garden would be run (filed with the minutes).

<u>Sandra Coe</u> – spoke about asking Jeff Renihan to do the first aid training for the counselor's.

<u>Attorney Richardson</u> – noted that there are some minor changes for example Paragraph 3 there is a blank for the last session of the camp it should read July 23 – August 3. In Paragraph 4 should read 22 participants, if the program had less than 22 in any of the session's the Town had the option to cancel the program.

Attorney Richardson- the Town would have to obtain all the necessary paper work.

Sandra Coe – noted that she will obtain all the proper paper work from the Health Department.

<u>Councilwoman Milicaj</u> – asked about Item # 15 that each party indemnifies and releases the other from and against any and all actions why is the Town releasing.

<u>Attorney Richardson</u> – noted that the Town is utilizing their facility and if something happens from the result of a counselor's behavior and it would maybe effect a child in the care of Rainbow's End. The Town is providing the same comfort to Rainbow's End and the YMCA has they are providing to the Town.

RE: ADOPTING LOCAL LAW 1/2012 ENTITLED "A LOCAL LAW OF THE TOWN OF PLEASANT VALLEY, DUTCHESS COUNTY, NEW YORK REPEALING CHAPTER 50 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF PLEASANT VALLEY AND ADOPTING A NEW FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION LAW

WHEREAS, the Flood Insurance Rate Map establishing 100 year base flood elevations for the Town of Pleasant Valley has been completed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board recently received a recommendation from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to amend the Code of the Town of Pleasant Valley to correctly reference the revised Flood Insurance Rate Map; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid amendment is required for the Town of Pleasant Valley's continued eligibility in the National Flood Insurance Program; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pleasant Valley has determined that it is necessary to rescind the current Chapter 50 entitled, "Flood Damage Prevention" to be replaced with a new Chapter 50 entitled, "Flood Damage Prevention" in order to be in compliance with the revised Flood Insurance Rate Map; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that it is in the best interest of the residents of the Town of Pleasant Valley to adopt such a local law; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of such a local law is a Type II action pursuant to 6 NYCRR Section 617.5(c)(20) and (27) and is otherwise exempt from the environmental review pursuant to the New York State Environmental Review Act; and

WHEREAS, a Resolution was duly adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Pleasant Valley introducing proposed Local Law 1 of 2012, Chapter 50 Flood Damage Prevention; and

WHEREAS, the Public Hearing was duly advertised in the Poughkeepsie Journal, the official newspaper of the Town; and

Following, that such employee may elect to continue such medical insurance coverage under the same premium payment provisions as shown in the "Premium Payment" paragraph of this section. The individual must have at least fifteen consecutive years of service with the Town and been granted an official disability related retirement by the New York State Retirement System. Coverage will also continue for eligible dependent(s). If such disabled employee or Elected Official should die before his or her dependent(s), the dependent(s) may continue medical insurance coverage provided they pay the full cost of the premium.

If the spouse of a disabled employee or Elected Official has medical insurance available through his or her place of employment, the family coverage must be taken by the employed spouse. If the employee or Elected Official has no other dependents, the spouse need only obtain medical insurance for him or herself through his or her place of employment.



Crys also noted that the building is currently off the tax roll so there would be no further burden on the tax payers of Pleasant Valley and the septic system would have to be upgraded.


Town Attorney, Scott Volkman stated that the building is an 11 thousand square foot building and not going to be used as a day care facility also.




