#### **PUBLIC HEARING**

#### **REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING**

#### **AUGUST 12, 2015**

The Pleasant Valley Town Board held a Public Hearing and their regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, August 12, 2015 at 7:00PM at Town Hall, 1554 Main Street, Pleasant Valley.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING:**

**PURPOSE:** Amending Chapter 98 of the Code of the Town of Pleasant Valley entitled "Zoning, Article IV Supplementary Regulations, Section 98-46 Signs":

Supervisor Campbell noted that she is in receipt of the Affidavit of Publication from the Poughkeepsie Journal dated July 24, 2015 and the Affidavit of Posting by the Town Clerk dated July 21, 2015.

Motion by Councilwoman Milicaj, seconded by Councilman Albrecht the Town Board opened the Public Hearing to the public, carried.

Town Attorney, Scott Volkman noted that the Town Board would need additional information on this local law. Mr. Volkman suggests that the Town Board adjourn the Public Hearing to another date. Mr. Volkman did note that the Town Board has received the recommendation from Dutchess County Planning and their recommendation is filed with the minutes. It was also noted that the Town Board is waiting to hear back from the Town's Planning Board.

Zoning Administrator, Mike White explained the sign ordinance and mentioned that there is two (2) new sign types that need to be added to the ordinance. One would be lite open signs for business and the other being gas station price signs.

Councilman Albrecht spoke about the signs and banners for churches.

<u>Janet Gross – Creek Road</u> – feels that the cost of the sign permits are too high and that the Town should make it affordable for the residents in Pleasant Valley.

Rolando Ghedini – Abor Hill Drive – feels that the Town should make the law more reasonable.

Councilwoman Milicaj feels that the comprehensive plan should also be updated along with the updates to the code.

Motion by Councilman Albrecht, seconded by Councilman Latino the Town Board adjourned the Public Hearing until October 14, 2015, carried.

## **PUBLIC HEARING:**

**PURPOSE:** Amending the code of the Town of Pleasant Valley entitled "Chapter 17 Officers and Employees, Article 1, Defense and Indemnification".

Supervisor Campbell noted that she is in receipt of the Affidavit of Publication from the Poughkeepsie Journal dated July 24, 2015 and the Affidavit of Posting by the Town Clerk dated July 21, 2015.

Motion by Councilman Figliozzi, seconded by Councilman Albrecht the Town Board opened the Public Hearing to the public, carried.

Councilman Latino asked the Town Attorney when the Local Law can be tabled before or after public comment.

Town Attorney, Scott Volkman explained the procedure the Town Board would take to table the Local Law, the Town Board could close the Public Hearing, it is than an agenda item and it can be tabled at that time.

Don Sagliano asked what this local law is about.

Councilman Latino explained what the local law was and explained that our insurance carrier has asked us to inspect the Town's playgrounds on a bi-weekly basis. The role of the employee would be to inspect the playground equipment but they don't want to be held liable if a piece of equipment breaks after their inspection. Councilman Latino noted that before he adopts this local law he would like to speak to other Towns to see how their law works.

Councilwoman Milicaj stated that she is uncomfortable with this law. Councilwoman Milicaj noted that if the employee is not sure about the check list she can sit down with them to explain the procedure and what the insurance carrier is looking for.

Councilman Latino noted that if an employee choices not to perform the duties asked of them is insubordination. Councilman Latino also noted that this is not uncommon for employees of municipalities and school districts to cover their employees.

Town Attorney, Scott Volkman stated that this law mirrors the language authorized by New York State Public Officers Law allows this to be offered by Local Law. Mr. Volkman did note that a previous Town Board had passed a Local Law on the defense portion.

Councilman Latino asked the Town Attorney to clarify the difference between the two.

Town Attorney, Scott Volkman did explain the difference between Defense and Indemnification to the Town Board.

Councilwoman Milicaj stated why duplicate the law have NYMIR handle this there is no emergency to provide the language of the law.

<u>Bill Kern – Masten Road</u> – asked if this local law would apply to the Highway Department especially the union workers.

Councilman Latino explained how it effects the employees and there is nothing in the union contract not to defend them.

All residents having had ample time to speak the Town Board closed the meeting to the public. Motion by Councilwoman Milicaj, seconded by Councilman Figliozzi, carried.

<u>Item # 4 – Authorizing Additional Funding for Services Pertaining to Cricket Valley Proceedings & Amending Resolution No. 103/2015:</u>

Supervisor Campbell read the following resolution:

**TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION NO.: 145/2015** 

RE: AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR SERVICES PERTAINING TO THE CRICKET VALLEY PROCEEDING AND AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 103/2015

WHEREAS, Cricket Valley Energy Center, LLC has filed an application pursuant to Public Service Law Article VII for authorization to construct and operate a new approximately 14.6 mile 345-kilovolt transmission line to connect the Cricket Valley Energy Center, LLC generation facility in the Town of Dover, New York to the Pleasant Valley substation owned by Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. in the Town of Pleasant Valley, New York; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Service Law § 125(5), a fund in the amount of \$50,000 for intervenor funding had been established for the proceeding. The purpose of the intervenor funding is

to allow parties to contribute to the development of the complete record leading to an informed Public Service Commission decision, and to foster broad public participation in the proceeding; and

WHEREAS, the Town was awarded intervenor funding in an amount not to exceed \$6,500 pursuant to the ruling issued on September 26, 2014 which was fully expended; and

WHEREAS, no additional interveror funding is or will be made available; and

WHEREAS, the Town had agreed to work jointly with the Town of LaGrange and the Town of LaGrange Special Counsel with respect to this matter; and

WHEREAS, the Town believes it in the best interests of the Town to continue to be able to participate even in a limited manner in these proceedings; and

WHEREAS, the Town has retained the services of Gary S. Bowitch, Esq., Bowitch & Coffey, LLC, Albany, New York to jointly proceed with the Town of LaGrange with the Town of Pleasant Valley's contribution not to exceed \$5,000; and

WHEREAS, the Town of LaGrange has agreed to contribute equally towards this joint representation; and

WHEREAS, additional funds are again necessary to continue with the proceeding, with the Town of Pleasant Valley share not to exceed an additional \$2,500; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to amend Resolution No. 103/2015 to increase the Town of Pleasant Valley's contribution to an amount not to exceed \$7,500; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient funds available in the judgment and claims line of the 2015 adopted Town budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Pleasant Valley hereby authorizes the increase in funds for the retention of the services of Gary S. Bowitch, Esq. as part of a cooperative engagement agreement in an amount not to exceed \$7,500 from funds from the judgement and claims line of the 2015 adopted Town budget and such funds are appropriated therefore; and be it further

RESOLVED, that terms of the engagement agreement dated May 8, 2015 that was authorized by

Resolution No. 109/2015 shall continue to remain in full force and effect.
